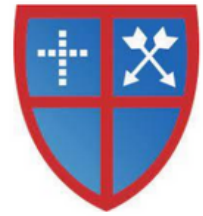

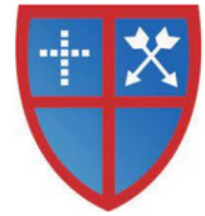

KSI SINGING AT THE BANDSTAND



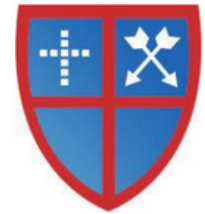

The trip provided an enriching cultural experience and deepened their understanding and respect for diverse beliefs

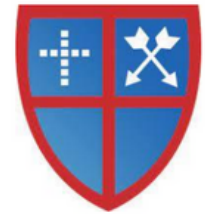


EYFS - TEDDY BEARS PICNIC

Lilia - "I want to improve on my colouring."

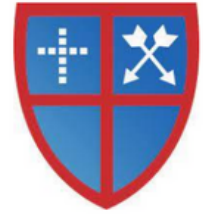
Ava- "In our SATS, we had to show resilience and keep trying even when questions were difficult!"

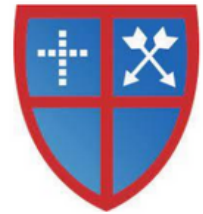

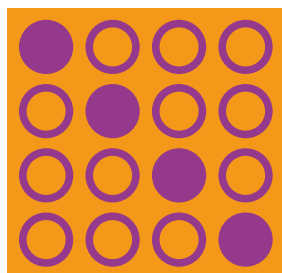
- Free, healthy, and tasty food
