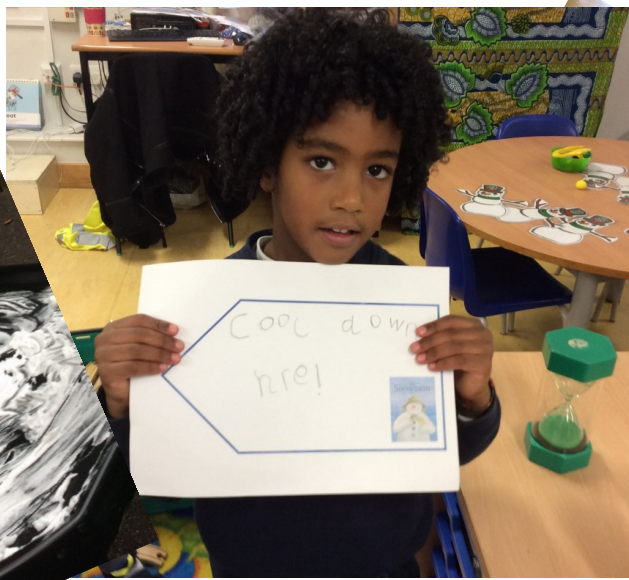
Online Safety Parent Workshop: Tuesday 26th March 6-7pm. (evening session via zoom).
