

## ENGLISH

We use The Literacy Tree scheme in class. Books are read closely and used to inspire a range of writing across genres as well as to explore punctuation, spelling and grammar.

Our books this term will be

- **Anne Frank:** Letters, short descriptions, extended diary entries
- **Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race:** Memoir of Dorothy Vaughn
- **The Lizzie and Belle Mysteries: Drama and Danger:** Posters, diary entries, persuasive speeches

## SCIENCE

We use Kapow planning in class to take an approach that includes learning both scientific knowledge and investigative skills. This term we will be looking at:

- **Earth and Space:** describing different models of space, explaining how day and night and seasons occur, describing how the Moon orbits the Earth and analysing patterns in order to make predictions
- **Living things: Lifecycles and reproduction:** describing the lifecycles of plants and animals, posing questions and comparing different lifecycles and using data to make predictions

## MUSIC

This term we will cover:

- **Pop Ballads:** including the song 'Make you feel my love' by Adele
- **Hip-hop Music:** including the 'Fresh Prince of Bel-Air'

## MATHS

We use The White Rose scheme in class to take a mastery approach. Topics are taught through fluency, reasoning and problem solving using a spiralling sequence in weekly blocks. This term we will be looking at topics including:

- **Fractions:** adding and subtracting fractions including mixed numbers—breaking the whole number
- **Decimals** adding and subtracting decimals across the whole number, using complements to one
- **Multiplication and Division:** multiply and divide 4 digits by 1, multiply 2 digits by 2, multiply 3 and 4 digits by 2 digits, multiplying and dividing by powers of 10
- **Statistics:** drawing line graphs, reading and interpreting line graphs

## RE

We use the Southwark Diocesan scheme to explore religious knowledge as well as apply it to our own understanding of the world. This term we will be studying

- **How has the Christian message survived for over 2,000 Years?** How the Christian message spread in the past, Ascension, persecution, Pentecost, The Holy Trinity, The Holy Spirit, confirmation
- **How does Easter offer hope?** Forgiveness and salvation and how this is shown in the Easter story, clean slate, forgiveness, the stations of the cross, resurrection

## DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

Our DT week will be the penultimate week before Easter

### Textiles: Stuffed Toys

- ◆ Design a stuffed toy, considering the main component shapes of their toy.
- ◆ Create an appropriate template for their stuffed toy.
- ◆ Join two pieces of fabric using a blanket stitch.
- ◆ Neatly cut out their fabric.
- ◆ Use blanket stitch to assemble their stuffed toy.

## ART

We develop art across the curriculum but focus on skills and art analysis on the penultimate week of the Spring half term. This term we will be looking at:

- **Painting:** Children will look at the work of *Ed Ruscha* and explore the use of colour with different media.

## GEOGRAPHY & HISTORY

This term history and Geography will be taught through our topics **WWII** and **The Great Barrier Reef**. We will continue our learning about the Second World War and its effect on Britain. We will then look at environmental factors linked to our oceans and study the Great Barrier Reef.

## PSHE

We continue to use the Coram SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship) scheme. This term we are looking at:

### Keeping Myself Safe:

Understanding what a habit is, habits being hard to change, weighing up risks in decision making, strategies for face to face and online bullying including supporting others, understanding dares, standing up to someone who dares you, how to manage a risky situation, what information to share online/offline, consequence of sharing personal information, protecting personal information, complexities of categorising drugs, all medicines are drugs but not all drugs are medicines, misconceptions around the 'norms' of cigarettes/alcohol.

### Rights and Responsibilities:

Identify and discuss issues about wellbeing in the media, express opinions and make recommendations, fact, opinion, biased reporting, responsibilities, rights, duties, impact on not carrying out our duties/responsibilities, voluntary/community/pressure groups, costs in making and selling a product, consumer questions, credit, debt, interest, personal finance solutions, council and local councillors

## PE

We have two PE sessions a week and one lesson is led by our PE specialist Mr Mallet. This term we will be upskilling in

- **Tag Rugby:** handling, tagging, passing, running with the ball, movement off the ball, attacking and defending principles, small sided games
- **Hockey:** fundamental hockey skills, ball possession, basic hockey rules, dribbling, passing skills, moving and passing, spatial awareness, shooting

## FRENCH

We use the Linguascope resources to support our French learning and this term we are learning vocabulary and phrases around **Chores, Weather, Transport & Travel**.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Although your children are now in Year 5, you still have an important part to play with listening to their reading on a regular basis. Please do listen to your child read aloud for at least 10 minutes as often as you can. You can also support the children with getting into good routines for self organisation; packing their bag the night before, planning when they will do homework.

Your children are also still very welcome to bring some fruit in for a playtime snack.

- **Computer Science:** systemised and logical approaches, using diagrams and flow charts, write programs with 'loop' statements, to identify and debug errors
